Building our community...

The year **1970** also proved to be an exciting year for Arrowhead. The North Lake was finished, sections 8-12 were opened for sale, and the Island Pool was completed.



By the summer of **1973**, beaches were completed at the North Lake (Beach 4) as well as a beach at Island Pool, previously called Pleasure Island.

Tip of the Arrow

The summer of 1975 brought more enhancements to the community including the grand opening of the Tip of the Arrow Restaurant in the lodge. Led by Chef Chet Brzoska, the full scale restaurant offered a variety of menu items including the specialty of the house, French Fried Ice Cream!

The Chipmunk Snack Bar was also another food option at the lake. Today, this is known as the Pinewood Deli!

As the community took shape, more activities became available. The ski slope gained popularity in the 1970s. The Apres Ski Lounge, located inside the clubhouse, offered a place to warm up after a day of skiing. Ice skating was also available.

Teen and adult dances were very popular this decade. Lighting was added to the tennis courts to allow for night time playing. The Arrowhead Special (bus pictured below) provided transportation to kids around the lake.





WERE YOU BORN A DRAGON? was published in November 2019 and is based on bedtime stories he told his daugher Rachel when she was young. Steve can turn into a dragon and they would fly off the Land of Dragons and have marvelous adventures. The book tells of Rachel's first trip there where she must get the blessing of Zargon, the King of Dragons, so that she can be raised to become a dragon herself. Along the way, her big brother Steven is her guardian and protects her from a mean dragon who means her harm. It's a story of standing up to bullies and brotherly love,

WERE YOU BORN A DRAGON TOO?, published in 2021, is the follow-up book and take place on Rachel's first birthday. The trio promised Zargon that they would return every year on her birthday. When they arrive, Steven is wisked away by two dragon, Singe and Scorch, who will be his teachers and show him what he needs to know in order to become a dragon. Of course, the 8 year old Steven just wants to have fun on this trip, but the teachers show him the value of a good education and how learning can be fun, which is the theme of the second book.

MEET THE AUTHOR...

Steve Dragon started coming to the Poconos when he was 8 years old. His parents rented a cabin at Monroe Lake in Marshalls Creek from a family friend every August. At 17, he met his future wife Mary Ellen and discovered that her parents owned a cabin in Pine Flats, also in the Marshalls Creek area. They spent plenty of time at the family cabin and once they had children, they continued to bring them to the Poconos.

In 2014, they started to look for their own place and, on the recommendation of a co-worker, found their new vacation home in Arrowhead Lake. Now, they bring their two grandsons with them and they love Arrowhead as much as Steve and Mary Ellen do.

In 2021, Steve retired from the automotive industry after 46 years in the business. He now has more time to spend at Arrowhead and on his second career as an author of children's books.

Steve is still working on his third volume of the series, but in the meantime he loves attending craft shows to sell his books and get them out to the public. He attended last year's craft show at Arrowhead and sold quite a few books. Do you have a copy of the books for your little ones?
